

Invitation to receive a COVID-19 vaccine

Information for Phase 1 healthcare workers

OFFICIAL

As a Phase 1 healthcare worker you are eligible to receive a COVID-19 vaccine now.

The vaccine is safe, effective and free.

By getting vaccinated you are helping to protect yourself and your family from COVID-19.

- If you are aged 50 years and over, you can now access the AstraZeneca vaccine through a State vaccination clinic or your GP (see below).
- If you are under 50 years of age, you are now eligible to receive the Pfizer vaccine by booking at a State vaccination clinic (see below).

Eligibility

Healthcare workers eligible in phase 1 are detailed <u>here</u>. This includes public/private and hospital/community based workers.

Residential disability workers under 50 years will be vaccinated with Pfizer as part of the Commonwealth vaccination program across residential disability sites.

How to book an appointment

Metropolitan Melbourne locations: Carlton, Heidelberg, Ringwood, South Wharf, Sunshine, and various sites across south-east Melbourne

Regional Victoria locations: Geelong, Ballarat, Wodonga (taking bookings from 4 May), Shepparton (taking bookings from 4 May), Traralgon and Bendigo.

Additional sites are coming online regularly, and can be offered at point of booking where available.

Preparing for vaccination

After you book your appointment you will receive an email confirmation. Please read this email carefully, as it has important instructions about what you need to do on the day of your vaccination.

What to bring

- Medicare card (if you have one) or Individual Health Identifier (if you have one)
- Photo ID that shows date of birth e.g. a Victorian driver's licence
- Proof of occupation (ID card, letter from your employer or Eligibility Declaration Form)

You should wait at least 14 days after the flu vaccine to receive a dose of the COVID-19 vaccine.
